USO Puget Sound Readies Disneyland Send-Off for Children of Fallen Heroes Joins American Airlines at Sea-Tac for Area's First Snowball Express

Seattle – The USO Puget Sound Area (USOPSA) will join American Airlines and the Snowball Express to provide a festive send-off to Disneyland, complete with Santa Claus, for children and families from the Puget Sound area whom have lost a parent serving in the U.S. Armed Forces in Afghanistan or Iraq. The Disneyland send-off is scheduled for Tuesday, 7:00 AM, Dec. 16, Gate A9, at Sea-Tac Airport.

The Snowball Express provides all-expense paid Disneyland vacations during the holidays. This is the first time children from the Puget Sound area have joined the Snowball Express. On Dec. 16, 25 children, ages 4 to 16, with family members, will depart from Sea-Tac and join 2000 children nationwide in Disneyland and other adventure stops in Southern California.

"Our mission is about showing true gratitude. These are the children of service members whom have given their lives, and made the ultimate sacrifice while serving in the U.S. Armed Forces," says Don Leingang, USOPSA executive director, "We commend American Airlines for their support of this program and for giving us the opportunity to express our gratitude to these families."

The program, sponsored by American Airlines, began after the 9/11 attacks as an act of gratitude to the nation's military families and to support the children of our fallen heroes. Numerous USO volunteers will escort families through security and provide special decorations, gift bags, and festivities at the departure gate. Logistics for Santa's arrival have been worked out with the North Pole.
